



# 2026 ROSEVILLE ICE SHOW FEATURE ELIGIBILITY



*Ice show features are intended to be a celebration of skaters  
who train for USFS within the Roseville Skating Academy*

## To Qualify:

1. Skaters must be a current member of **ROSEVILLE SKATING ACADEMY**
  - a. Skater must be enrolled in the Summer and/or Fall Skate School and must be enrolled in Winter/Spring Sessions.
  - b. Skater is expected to skate at least 20 “Roseville Skating Academy” classes of the Summer, Fall and Winter/Spring sessions. Skaters be on the ice within the first 10 minutes of class to receive attendance credit. **Dates are June 12, 2025 – April 11, 2026**
  - c. Skaters are expected to make good faith effort to attend each class.
  - d. Rehearsal week and ice show weekend are mandatory attendance - April 13 - April 17, 2026.
  - e. A skater who has been awarded a feature for the 2026 ice show may be at risk of losing their feature for not attending mandatory rehearsals and/or completing their requirements.
2. Skater must be a current home club member of the **ROSEVILLE FIGURE SKATING CLUB (RFSC)**.
  - a. Skater must purchase a minimum of **8 ice contract sessions** during 5 contract periods offered by RFSC. The 5 contract periods are Summer, Fall, Winter I, Winter II and Spring. Random buy ons will be accepted in lieu of a contract when the number of random buy ons equal the number of contract weeks. (i.e. 8 week contract = 8 random buy on.)
  - b. Skaters are expected to make good faith effort to attend every required contract session and expected to skate the full 60 minutes of the contract. Skaters may miss 2 times if needed
  - c. To receive credit for the time skated, skaters are expected to skate the full 60 minutes of the RFSC contract they are skating. Skaters arriving on the ice 10 minutes after the contract begins or leaving before the 50 minutes of the contract ending time will not receive credit for that RFSC ice time
  - d. Minimum 6 RFSC ice contracts must be fulfilled but the end of Winter 1 contract
3. Skater must have skated in the previous year’s Roseville Ice Show.
4. Skaters must submit/turn in a sign acknowledgement form with skater and parent signatures that they have received, read and understand the feature guidelines and code of conduct. Acknowledgement form must be turned in no later than November 30<sup>th</sup>
5. Skater must have passed at least ISI Freestyle 5 **or** Bronze Singles **or** a USFS competition level that requires a axel to be performed (i.e. Preliminary excel plus or pre-preliminary well-balanced or above.) Skaters using a competition level to qualify must submit a IJS protocol sheet showing the skater competed and that they were awarded full credit for at least one axel in their program (no downgrades, under rotation or falls can be used to qualify. GOEs will not be taken into consideration.) Competitions must take place between December 1st and Nov 30<sup>th</sup> to qualify for the following years ice show. (i.e. competitions between December 1<sup>st</sup> 2024 and Nov 30<sup>th</sup> 2025 can be used to qualify for 2026 ice show.) USFS test sheets and IJS protocol sheets must be provided to the Coordinator/Kelli no later than November 30, 2025. **Absolutely no late submissions will be accepted.** If using IJS protocol, you must submit a IJS protocol every year until you are awarded a feature. IJS Protocol will not carry over year to year and you can not have more than 1 feature. **\*Please note: For 2027 ice show and beyond, we will only be using USFS Tests and USFS IJS Protocol to qualify for a feature.**

6. Skaters must participate in a US Figure Skating/ISI competition or US Figure Skating/ISI test during the year leading up to feature awards. Year will be Dec 1, 2024 – Nov 30, 2025. **\*Please note: For 2027 ice show and beyond, we will only be using USFS tests and competition to qualify for a feature.**
7. Skater are expected to respect coaches, skaters, parents and rink staff in addition to abiding by the code of conduct set by Roseville Skating Academy. Please set a good example for all skaters.
8. No bullying of any kind (Cyber bullying, harassment, threatening etc.) will be tolerated and may result in losing your feature.
9. Skater's primary coach must be a member of RFSC and either full-time home professional of the Roseville Skating Academy and/or RFSC home/associate club professional.
10. Attendance exemptions may be considered for a skater in the event of a temporarily disabling medical condition or an extreme circumstance with an accompanying doctor's note. Consideration will be based on the validity of the claim, the effort by the skater to abide by the rules, and the skater's medical clearance for the show
11. If a skater is injured prior to ice show, a Doctor's consent note must be given to the Skate School Coordinator a minimum two (2) weeks prior to Ice Show performances to allow that skater to perform in the Ice show. If a skater cannot provide such consent the skater will not be allowed to perform in the Ice Show
12. Skaters unable to fulfill these requirements will not be eligible for a feature for 2026 ice show.

### **Awarding a Feature:**

1. There will be a limit of two features, skater must not have had a feature in the past. There may be a need for an additional feature due to special circumstances decided by the Skating Academy Coordinator
2. Skaters who are a senior in high school who have passed minimum Pre-Bronze Singles and not eligible for a solo, will be awarded a feature starting with seniors in the highest USFS freestyle level. If there are three seniors in the highest level, there will be three features awarded that year. If there are four or more seniors in the highest level, two seniors will be drawn at random and awarded a feature
3. If there are no seniors eligible for a feature, features will be drawn from skaters in Fs 6(passed ISI FS 5/passed Bronze singles) and above and who have not earned a solo.
4. If there are just two skaters passed Fs 5/passed Bronze Singles level they will be given the feature spots. If there is one skater passed Fs 5/passed Bronze Singles, that skater will automatically be given the feature and the second feature will be drawn from the level(s) below.
  - If there are not enough eligible skaters passed Fs 5/passed Bronze Singles or above for two features, the coordinator may decide to pull from Freestyle 5/LTS USA Free Skate 5-6/Pre-Bronze Singles or may decide to have only one feature that year.
5. ISI Freestyle tests must be taken and registered through the Roseville Skate School. We will continue ISI testing for the 2025-26 skate school year (June 2025-April 2026)
6. The test level used for making the Ice Show feature decision will be finalized by November 30.
7. Learn To Skate USA tests must be taken and registered through the Roseville Skating Academy during Bronze and/or Silver Academy classes. Tests beyond LTS USA (Pre-Preliminary and above) need to be taken through a USFS sanctioned test session either in-person or virtually.
8. Skaters given a feature are also expected to skate in their Academy group number for the ice show.
9. The feature skater will be responsible for their costume and should coordinate with your feature group's costume.
10. Feature skaters will be incorporated into one 6-8 year old class & one 9-18 year old class for an ice show number, as decided by the Skate School Coordinator
