



# 2026 ROSEVILLE ICE SHOW

## SOLO ELIGIBILITY



*Ice Show solos are intended to be a celebration of skaters who train for USFS within the Roseville Skating Academy*

### To Qualify:

- 1) Skater must be a current member of the ROSEVILLE SKATING ACADEMY
  - a. Skater must be enrolled in the Summer and/or Fall Skate School and must be enrolled in Winter/Spring Sessions.
  - b. Skater is expected to skate at least 20 "Gold Academy" classes of the Summer, Fall and Winter/Spring sessions. Skaters be on the ice within the first 10 minutes of class to receive attendance credit. **Dates are June 12, 2025 – April 11, 2026**
  - c. Skaters are expected to make good faith effort to attend each class.
  - d. Rehearsal week and ice show weekend are mandatory attendance - April 13 - April 17, 2026.
  - e. A skater who has been awarded a solo for the 2026 ice show may be at risk of losing their solo for not attending mandatory rehearsals and/or completing their requirements.
- 2) Skater must also be a current Home club member of the ROSEVILLE FIGURE SKATING CLUB (RFSC).
  - a. Skater must purchase and skate a minimum of 10 ice contract sessions during 5 contract periods offered by RFSC. The 5 contract periods are Summer, Fall, Winter I, Winter II and Spring. Random buy ons will be accepted in lieu of a contract when the number of random buy ons equal the number of contract weeks. (i.e. 8 week contract = 8 random buy ons.)
  - b. Minimum of 6 contracts must be fulfilled by the end of Winter I contract.
  - c. Skaters are expected to make good faith effort to attend every required RFSC contract session and expected to skate the full 60 minutes of the contract. Skater may miss up to 2 times per contract if needed. Skaters must sign in on the iPad each time they skate.
  - d. To receive credit for the time skated, skater's are expected to skate the full 60 minutes of the contract they are skating. Skaters arriving on the ice 10 minutes after the contract begins or leaving before the 50 minutes of the contract ending time will not receive credit for that RFSC ice time.
- 3) Skater must have skated in the previous year's Roseville ice show.
- 4) Skater are expected to respect coaches, skaters, parents and rink staff in addition to abiding by the code of conduct set by Roseville Skating Academy. Please set a good example for all skaters.
- 5) No bullying of any kind (Cyber bullying, harassment, threatening etc.) will be tolerated and may result in losing your solo.
- 6) Skaters must submit/turn in a sign acknowledgement form with skater and parent signatures that they have received, read and understand the solo guidelines and code of conduct. Acknowledgement form must be turned in no later than November 30<sup>th</sup>
- 7) Skater's primary coach must be a member of RFSC and either full-time home professional of the Roseville Skating Academy and/or RFSC home/associate club professional.

8) All soloists must have passed at least freestyle 6 or USFS Pre-Silver singles, or a USFS competition level that requires a axel and at least one double jump to be performed (i.e. Pre-Juvenile excel plus, Juvenile excel plus, Preliminary well-balanced or above.) Skaters using a competition level to qualify must submit a IJS protocol sheet showing the skater competed and that they were award full credit for at least one axel and one double in the same program (no downgrades, under rotation or falls can be used to qualify. GOEs will not be taken into consideration.) Competitions must take place between December 1st and Nov 30<sup>th</sup> to qualify for the following years ice show. (i.e. competitions between December 1<sup>st</sup> 2024 and Nov 30<sup>th</sup> 2025 can be used to qualify for 2026 ice show.) This may mean fewer than 8 solos will be awarded. USFS test sheets and IJS protocol sheets must be provided to the Coordinator/Kelli no later than November 30, 2025. Absolutely no late submissions will be accepted. If using IJS protocol, you must submit a IJS protocol every year to requalify for a solo. IJS Protocol will not carry over year to year.

***\*Please note: For the 2027 Ice show and going forward only USFS Tests and USFS Competition IJS protocol sheets will be used to qualify for a solo. ISI Freestyle 6 test will no longer be used to qualify for a solo.\****

9) Skaters wanting a solo must participate in any individual ISI freeskate or USFS freeskate competition and attempt any ISI or USFSA test. The competition and testing must take place between December 1 and November 30<sup>th</sup> in the year previous to ice show. i.e. competitions between December 1, 2024 and November 30<sup>th</sup> 2025 can be used to qualify for 2026 ice show.

***\*Please note: For the 2027 Ice show and going forward, skaters must participate in a USFS competition and take at least one USFS test. ISI competitions and tests will no longer be used to qualify for a solo.\****

10) Skaters unable to fulfill these requirements will not be eligible for a solo for 2026 ice show.

### **Awarding Solo's:**

1) A skater representing the Roseville Skating Academy who has passed USFS Senior/Gold Singles Freeskate will be given a solo.

2) A skater who has passed their ISI freestyle 6 or Pre-silver singles test when solos are awarded, and is a Senior in High School, will be given a solo.

3) There will be a limit of 8 solos. If there are 7 or more seniors, the limit will change to 9 solos.

4) If there are less than 6 skaters who have passed Freestyle 6 or Pre-Silver singles or qualify using USFS IJS protocol sheet and eligible for a solo, we may use a skaters(s) below these thresholds to fill solo positions up to 6 solo positions.

5) All but the last two solo positions will be awarded by rank to the highest freestyle/singles level skaters in order of tests passed.

a. If there are exactly 8 skaters total, between the highest and the lowest freestyle/singles level(s) being awarded solos, those 8 will complete the solo selection.

b. If there are more than 8 skaters in solo contention, the last 2 solo positions will be determined age of the skaters qualifying for a solo with the oldest two skaters being awarded the solos.

c. If a skater has been in the running for the 7<sup>th</sup> or 8<sup>th</sup> solo (which is determined by age) two years in a row and was not awarded a solo the previous year, they will automatically be awarded the remaining solo position.

*\*The 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> solo selection process assumes only 8 solos. Add 1 solo if 7 or more seniors increase the count to 9 solos.*

6) ISI Freestyle tests must be taken and registered through the Roseville ISI Skate School. We will continue ISI testing for the 2025-26 skate school year

7) USFS tests may be taken virtual or in person. USFS tests taken using 'Test Credit' at a competition must show that the skater completed the required jumps, step or choreo sequences and spins required at a virtual or in-person test. For example: Bronze Singles test has an axel, 3 different singles or doubles, one 2 or 3 jump combo, combination spin, one spin in one position and step sequence required to pass if taken in person or virtually. A skater using a test credit to test Bronze Singles must provide the IJS protocol sheet proving they completed at those required elements for the test.

8) All test levels for solos will be finalized November 30th.

9) All soloists will be responsible for the cost and making of their own costume.

10) Attendance exemptions may be considered for a skater in the event of a temporarily disabling medical condition or an extreme circumstance with an accompanying doctor's note. Consideration will be based on the validity of the claim, the effort by the skater to abide by the rules, and the skater's medical clearance for the show.

11) If a skater is injured prior to ice show, a Doctor's consent note must be given to the Skate School Coordinator minimum two (2) weeks prior to Ice Show performances to allow that skater to perform in the Ice show. If a skater cannot provide such consent the skater will not be allowed to perform in the Ice Show.
