

## 2.7 RFSC CLUB NUMBERS FOR THE ROSEVILLE ICE SHOW

### 2.7.1 APPLICATION

- a. Application will be available to RFSC members no later than October 15th.
- b. Application and payment must be submitted using US Mail, postmarked no later than December 1st. If December 1st falls on a Sunday during any given year, the deadline will be December 2nd for that year only.
- c. An online application process MAY be implemented, if utilized the application will be available to RFSC members no later than October 15th. The deadline for receipt and payment will be the same as noted in 2.7.1 (b).
- d. There will be a maximum of 18 skaters accepted for CLUB A and 22 skaters accepted for CLUB B, based on qualifications and seniority. In the event of a tie, it will be the Board of Directors discretion to approve more than the maximum skaters.
- e. Skaters that do not qualify for either the Club A or Club B number will have their application and check returned no later than December 31st.
- f. NO REFUNDS AFTER PLACEMENT HAS BEEN POSTED

### 2.7.2 REQUIREMENTS

- a. RFSC Home club members only in good standing and have met all requirements.
- b. Seniority is based on when the skater became a full RFSC member.
- c. USFSA and ISI tests taken prior to application deadline will count toward establishing Club A or Club B placement.
- d. Have not yet graduated from high school.
- e. Only 1 absence of any kind will be permitted, this includes Ice Show rehearsal week. A club number coach must be notified prior to the absence. The skater is responsible for learning the missed choreography.
- f. If you are more than 10 minutes late 3 times you may not be allowed to skate in the club number.
- g. By a majority vote of the Board of Directors, skaters may be removed from club number if the club number coach feels they are being disruptive.
- h. The contract year will commence with the contract immediately following the previous year's ice show, and will include Summer, Fall, Winter I, Winter II and Spring ice contracts. The Spring ice contract concurrent with the ice show is required.
- i. The skater's total points will include points for Skating Skills tests passed, points for Singles tests passed, points for Pattern Dance and Solo Pattern Dance tests passed, points for Free Dance and Solo Free Dance tests passed and points for ISI tests passed.

#### 2.7.2.1 Club A

- a. Passed at least the USFSA Bronze Singles and/or ISI Freestyle 5
- b. Must have contracted **4** out of 5 contract periods, Spring contract is mandatory.
- c. Must contract two sessions during each of the contracted periods. A minimum of 8 sessions must be contracted annually. During each session, one contract may be a 10-session coupon pack. Skaters should

make a good-faith effort to use as many coupons as possible within the contract period in which they were purchased. Contracts need to be in by the end of the first week of the contact period to be valid.

d. You must attempt 1 USFSA test per a year, Skating Skills or Singles

### 2.7.2.2 Club B

a. Passed at least the USFSA Pre-Preliminary Skating Skills

b. Must have contracted **3** out of 5 contract periods, Spring contract is mandatory.

c. During each session, one contract may be a 10-session coupon pack. Skaters should make a good-faith effort to use as many coupons as possible within the contract period in which they were purchased. Contracts need to be in by the end of the first week of the contact period to be valid. Beginner coupons do not count as a contract.

### 2.7.3 Points

a. Will be given to skaters based on their USFSA Tests passed

2.7.4 Posting of skater placement in Club A and Club B numbers

- a. Club number coaches will be voted on at the October board meeting.
- b. All verification needs to be completed within 10 days after December 1st.
- c. Contracts and 10-session coupon packs purchased and use – verified by Club Treasurer
- d. Member in good standing – verified by Club Treasurer
- e. Test passed – verified by Test Chair
- f. Seniority points – verified by Membership Chair
- g. The Board of Directors will vote on Club A and Club B roster, no later than December 21st.
- h. Club number rosters will be posted no later than January 1st
- i. Club number coaches will be included in the board meeting to provide input and guidance as needed.
- j. Primary coach will be responsible to inform their skaters who did not qualify.
- k. Beginning with the 2027 ice show, all points will be based on UFSA tests only.
